\ ENJOY AT ENOSHIMA! / INTRODUCTION TOURIST SPOTS



01) Enoshima Iwaya Cave

The caves formed by wave erosion, located at the back of the island, Cave 1 is 152 meter long, and legend has it that it is connected to the ice caves on Mt. Fuji. Stone statues and cave walls lit by candle flames invite you into a world of mystery. Cave 2 is also said to be the site of the legend of the Dragon God.





02 Enoshima Samuel Cocking Garden

Visitors can enjoy seasonal flowers such as camellias and roses, and there are also a lighthouse, squares, cafes,

The winter illumination is breathtaking and is like a festival of color and light that makes the entire island





03) Enoshima Sea Candle

This observation lighthouse is in Samuel Cocking Garden. It has an indoor observation deck on the lower level and an outdoor observation deck on the upper level at 100 meters above sea level. It offers views of Mt. Fuii, the Izu Peninsula, mountains of Hakone and Tanzawa, It also has a café and a souvenir shop on the ground level.





04) Enoshima Shrine 🦇 Hetsumiya 👊 Nakatsumiya 🚾 Okutsumiya







Enoshima Shrine consists of Hetsumiya, Nakatsumiya and Okutsumiya, each shrine is dedicated to one of the three sister deities of the sea, collectively known as Enoshima Ookami. Enoshima also has a belief in Benzaiten, a Buddhist deity. They are both revered as deities of the sea, deities of water. deities that bring happiness and wealth and success in the arts.









Enoshima Yacht Harbor

Built as Japan's first competition vacht harbor for the 1964 Tokvo Olympics, it once again became the sailing venue for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, gaining global recognition.





06) Enoshima Aquarium

The local sea is introduced from various angles. Visitors can enjoy a school of 20.000 beautiful fish that live in Sagami Bay in the museum's largest tank. The jellyfish exhibit, in which more than 50 species can be observed at any given time, is also very popular.
